to provide for the establishment of a University to be known as the Abdul Wali Khan University, Mardan.

CHAPTER -I PRELIMINARY

Short title and commencement.---(1) This Act may be called the Abdul Wali Khan

CHAPTER -II

Establishment and Incorporation of the University.---(1) There shall be established a Shity to be known as Abdula With the University Mardan. University to be known as Abdul Wali Khan University, Mardan.

The University shall be a body corporate by the name of Abdul Wali Khan (3) The University shall be a body composition and a common seal and may, by the said name, sue University. Mardan having perpetual succession and a common seal and may, by the said name, sue and be sued.

The University shall be competent to acquire and hold property, both movable and (4) The University shall be competent to any movable or immovable property which may immovable, and to lease, sell or otherwise transfer any movable or immovable property which may have become vested in or been acquired by it.

Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, the University shall have academic, financial and administrative autonomy, including the powers to employ Officers. Teachers and other employees on such terms as may be prescribed, subject to the terms of this Act and the Higher Education Commission Ordinance. 2002 (LIII of 2002). In particular, and without prejudice to the authority granted to the Commission by the law, the Government or an authority or auditor appointed by the Government shall have power to question the policy underlying the allocation of resources approved by the senate in the annual budget of the University.

Jurisdiction of the University .--- The University shall exercise the powers conferred on it by 4. or under this Act within the territorial limits of the North-West Frontier Province and in respect of such other educational institutions as may apply to the University for exercise of its powers.

University open to all.---(1) The University shall be open to persons of either sex of 5. whatever religion, race, creed, colour or domicile who are academically qualified for admission to the courses of study offered by the University, and no such person shall be denied the privileges of the University on the ground at the formation of the University on the ground at the formation of the University of the Univers the University on the ground only of sex, religion, creed, caste, race, class, colour or domicile.

The University shall institute financial aid programmes for students in need on merit (3)basis, to the extent considered feasible by the Senate subject to the resources available.

52. <u>Power to acquire Officers, Teachers or employees to serve under Government or any</u> other Organization.---(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act:

- (a) the Senate may, after consultation with the Syndicate and in the public interest, direct that any Officer, University Teacher or other employee of the University shall serve in any post under Government or any other university or an educational or research institution and such direction shall be binding on the Officer, Teacher or other employee concerned; and
- (b) the Senate may, on the advice of the Syndicate, direct any post in the University to be filled by appointing an employee of Government or any other university or an educational or research institution.

(2) Where any appointment or transfer has been made under this section, the term's 'aild conditions of service of the appointee or transferee shall not be less favorable than those admissible to him immediately before such appointment or transfer and he shall be entitled to all benefits of his post of service.

53. <u>First appointment of Vice Chancellor</u>.---The first Vice Chancellor of this University shall be appointed by the Chancellor of this University on the recommendation of Government as soon after the commencement of this Act as possible.
