Subject: - **JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 264 ADOPTED BY THE PROVINCIAL
ASSEMBLY OF KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA.**

Dear Sir,

I am directed to say that the Provincial Assembly of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa in its sitting held on **06-07-2026** passed unanimously the following Resolution No.264 moved by Mr. Fateh ul Mulk Ali Nasir, Mr. Fazal Shakoor Minister for Labour, Mr. Muhammad Abdul Salam, Mr. Daud Shah, Mr. Abdul Karim, Mr. Abdul Kabir Khan, Mr. Muhammad Yamin and Mr. Fazal Haq Members Provincial Assembly of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The resolution is given below:-

“This House resolves that the Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa take immediate steps to re-establish Tehsil Khuzaar, with its headquarters at Shoghore, in District Lower Chitral.

The Lotkuh region, historically known as Khuzaar, was a separate governorate during the former Chitral State and was constituted as a Tehsil in 1954. It retained this status until the merger of Chitral State with Pakistan in 1969.

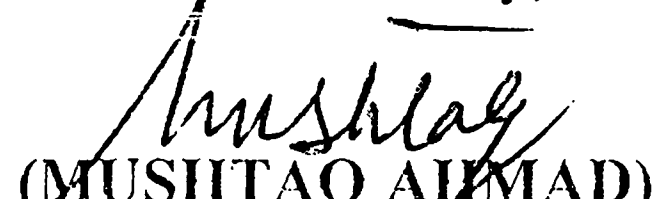
Spread over approximately 2,412 square kilometers, the region comprises the valleys of Garam Chashma, Karimabad, and Arkari. Owing to its vast area, rugged terrain, and heavy snowfall during winter, these valleys are frequently cut off from Chitral City, causing considerable hardship for the local population in accessing essential government services.

The region also holds strategic importance as it borders the Afghan provinces of Nuristan and Badakhshan and lies in close proximity to Tajikistan through the Wakhan Corridor. Effective administration of this sensitive frontier area requires a stronger local administrative presence

This House, therefore, recommends that the Government re-establish Tehsil Khuzaar with its headquarters at Shoghore to ensure improved governance, efficient public service delivery, enhanced disaster response, accelerated socio-economic development, and greater administrative convenience for the people of the Garam Chashma, Karimabad, and Arkari valleys”

You are, therefore requested that action taken on the resolution may be intimated to this Secretariat within a period of ninety days from the date of its communication under sub-rule (2) of Rule 165 of the Provincial Assembly of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Procedure and Conduct of Business Rules, 2025 for circulation amongst the Members of the Assembly.
